Owner/Applicant: 10027732 Manitoba Inc.

Civic Address: 59 Market Boulevard

Legal: Lot C, Plan 68630

Purpose of Conditional Use CU-2024-06: To allow a daycare centre to be located on the subject property. As per Zoning By-Law 2100, a daycare centre is a conditional use in the "C-MX" Commercial Mixed-Use Zone.

- 9.1 The City issued a tender request for the purchase of a residential garbage truck in 2022. At the September 20, 2022 council meeting, City council approved the tender and awarded the purchase contract to Shu-Pak Equipment Inc. for the amount of \$339,000 plus applicable taxes.

- 9.2 In 2014 and 2018, the city purchased similar equipment from Shu-Pajk with no issue. September 27, 2022 the City issued a deposit which enabled the City to qualify for a municipal customer discount.
- 9.3 This past summer, the City received a notice of bankruptcy from the appointed receivers. Until the matter is resolved, this amount will be reflected in the City's financial statements as an allowance for doubtful accounts.
- 9.4 A revised plan of equipment renewal and replacement for the solid waste department is being developed.
- 9.5 Mr. Warkentin was prepared to answer questions of council.

Re: Official Community Plan and Zoning By-Law Proposed Changes

Pursuant to Council's direction and approval of funding in 2023, administration has been working with its consultants to review and update both the City's Official Community Plan under By-Law 2099 and Zoning By-Law 2100. A regular review and update of the Official Community Plan is required every five years.

Both documents are in a draft stage with further public engagement and formal approval steps anticipated to begin in January 2025. Administration anticipates that public hearings for these documents would be held in March 2025.

A report is attached which highlights the more significant changes to both the OCP and Zoning By-Law. Administration requests that Council accept the general recommendations as provided in this report and provide direction for the City to proceed with the next phase of the review and approval process for these land use policy documents.

# Official Community Plan & Zoning By-Law Proposed Changes City Planner Report December 3, 2024

#### **Background**

The Planning Act requires all municipalities and urban centres to review their land use policies every five years to ensure that the policies that are in place are an accurate representation as to how we see the community growing and developing. The current Official Community Plan (By-Law 2099) and Zoning By-Law (2100) were adopted in 2018. Since spring of 2023 administration has been working with consultants to update, revise and make changes to the city's land use documents. Each document has been drafted and reviewed by administration and council as well as informally by the provincial planning office. Administration is at the point where public engagement will be scheduled to allow review and comments by the public prior to going to council for first reading. The intent of the report is to outline the major changes being proposed for both the Official Community Plan and Zoning By-Law.

The recommendation is for council to approve the proposed changes to allow the public consultation to proceed.

#### Official Community Plan (OCP)

The OCP provides the long-term vision and goals as to how we as administration and council want to see the city develop over the next 25-30 years. The policies that are put in place are to ensure that Steinbach is developing and growing in sync with that vision.

#### **OCP Format**

Section 1: *Introduction*-provides introductory information on the OCP and its context Section 2: *Plan Structure and Interpretation*-describes the rules and interpretation and overall structure of the OCP.

Section 3: *Planning Vision and Principles*-provides the overarching vision and planning principles that guides the policies within the OCP.

Section 4: General Policies- includes policies that apply to all areas of Steinbach.

Section 5: Land Use Designations- includes the policies related to specific land use designations.

Section 6: Implementation- provides information on implementing the OCP.

Section 7: Maps illustrate the land use designations within the City.

#### Changes to OCP

#### Planning Vision and Principles

The current OCP has a vision statement that encompasses two lines, whereas the new document expands on the vision and sets out planning principles for the city:

- Planning for Economic Development
- Planning for Growth
- Planning for Housing
- Planning for Active Transportation and Recreation
- Planning for Environment
- Planning for Downtown
- Planning for Collaboration
- Planning for Community

#### General Policies

#### 4.1 Land Development

- Expanded sections to include policies on affordable housing (4.1.17, 4.1.18)
- Included policies on energy efficiency and utilizing green energy where possible (4.1.2.13)
- The city should adopt tools and programs to maximize the creation and retention of a wide range of housing, and the retention and creation of rental units (4.1.2.17)

#### 4.2 Transportation

- Included policies on encouraging electric vehicle charging stations, future consideration/studies on the feasibility of public transportation (4.2.2.13)
- Increasing active transportation networks and ensuring new developments create active transportation connections (4.2.2.18, 4.2.2.19)

#### 4.3 Municipal Services and Utilities

- Expanded sections to ensure that buildings connected to municipal water systems shall not be serviced by private wells (4.3.2.2)
- Infrastructure in developing areas shall be designed to withstand extreme weather events (4.3.2.10)
- When reviewing development proposals, the City shall consider proximity to the City's waste management facility (landfill) and associated impacts on proposed development, particularly the residential uses (4.3.2.16)

# 4.4 Groundwater, Drainage, Hazard Lands, and Environment Expanded policies to include policies on:

- that any new development must control its runoff so that its contribution to the City's land drainage system is not greater than its pre-development condition (4.4.2.2)
- Surface runoff from developed properties shall be managed in accordance with the latest City of Steinbach storm water management guidelines and policies, including By-Law 1674 and regarding sump pumps (4.4.2.3)
- The City will establish a maximum 45.72 metre (150 ft) buffer adjacent to water bodies including drains (e.g. Keating Drain and Maning Canal) and the natural creek system (4.4.2.6)

#### Land Use Designations

Simplified section and includes new policies:

- 5.1 Residential Policy Areas & 5.2 Commercial Policy Areas
  - New residential development, including both subdivisions and designation of additional Residential Policy Areas shall be contiguous with existing development (5.1.2.2)
  - Infill housing on vacant lots in the Residential Policy Area shall be prioritized (5.1.2.3)

#### 5.2 Commercial Policy Areas

Simplified section including policies:

- Commercial uses shall be appropriately located as per the following:
  - General commercial areas that provide for the merchandising of goods and services of a general nature should be located along major streets and key intersections (5.2.2.1)
  - Highway commercial sites, shall primarily be located adjacent to PTH 12 and PTH 52, providing convenience to the traveling public
- Business attraction and retention will be encouraged through policies and zoning (5.2.2.5)
- The City shall support the creation of an appropriate range of lot sizes to accommodate a wide range of commercial uses (5.2.2.6)

# 5.3 Central Business District and Transitional District Policy Areas Simplified section includes policies on:

- Residential uses being permitted as part of mixed-use residential and commercial structures. (5.3.2.1)
- The City shall promote activity in the CBD through:
  - Recognizing the importance of larger outdoor spaces for social purposes.
     Support the provision of 'people watching' and spontaneous meeting spaces.
  - Promoting and conducting street festivals, parades, and other special events
     (5.3.2.5)
- New or infill development in the Transitional District Policy Area should consider the physical character of existing development. (5.3.2.11)
- Increased the area of the CBD to include the entire event centre area
- Reduced the area of the CBD and the Transitional District Pod where it does not make sense

#### 5.4 Industrial Policy Areas

Modified policies including:

• 5.4.2.1 New industry, or significant expansion of existing industries, shall be evaluated prior to development approval to ensure that there is adequate capacity

- within the City's water and wastewater systems. The development proponent is responsible for provision of any additional capacity that is required, subject to approval by the City. (5.4.2.1)
- Developments with heavy industrial uses shall be located near Roads and Transportation Association of Canada (RTAC) roads. Industrial uses shall be buffered from residential, recreational, and natural areas through fencing, landscape buffering, or other suitable materials (5.4.2.6)

#### 5.6 Parks and Open Space Policy Areas

Simplified section including policies on:

- Park design shall ensure universal accessibility for all ages and abilities (5.6.2.6)
- Public spaces and amenities shall be designed to withstand extreme weather events and minimize heat exposure (5.6.2.7)
- Parks may be designed to accommodate year-round activity (5.6.2.8)
- The City encourages communities and schools to establish community gardens to generate a culture of local and healthy food (5.6.2.9)

#### **Zoning By-Law**

The Zoning By-Law addresses the more immediate needs of planning and development. It is the guide that dictates how the city is built within the immediate five year window.

#### **Zoning By-Law Format**

Part A: *Administration*-Provides introductory information including direction for administration and interpretation of the by-law.

Part B: Zoning Districts-Describes zoning classifications, including any overlay zoning districts, and context for the Use and Dimensional Standards Table at the end of the document.

Part C: Development Standards-Provides general standards that apply to all development, as well as use-specific development standards.

Part D: Zoning Maps-illustrates where zoning districts apply in the City.

Part E: Definitions-includes definitions for words used throughout the by-law.

#### Changes to the Zoning By-Law

#### Part A: Administration (pages 2-13)

- Complete reorganization of the bylaw
- Elimination of overlap and redundant policies, number of pages has been reduced from 155 to 106 pages
- Removed permit requirement for decks anchored to a structure equal to or less than 2 feet above (2.7.g)
- Added note for lot line definitions that Designated Officer shall determine lot lines for irregular shaped lots

#### Part B: Zoning Districts

Central Business District (6.2)

- Required parking may be reduced by 1/3 for all uses in the Central Business District (CBD) (6.2)
- Design review considerations have been added:
  - Buildings should be oriented towards the street with entryways facing and connecting directly to the sidewalk
  - Architectural details, differentiated materials, and glazing on the ground floors of buildings are encouraged. Blank, at-grade street wall conditions exceeding 19.7 feet (6m) in length should not be permitted on any streetfacing building façade.
- New uses proposed in buildings that existed prior to the adoption of this by-law are exempt from parking requirements, except that the amount of accessory parking that existed prior to establishment of the new use shall not be reduced, except where renovation exceeds 50 percent of the structures assessed value, it is no longer exempt from parking requirements (6.2.11.c)
- Removed the requirement for street edge landscaping (7.6.8)
- Permitted mixed use dwellings as-of-right in the CBD, still requiring commercial on the main floor.

#### Transitional POD District (6.3)

- · Permitted offices and personal services as-of-right
- Permitted restaurants and clinics as-of-right in existing buildings (previously required a conditional use)
- Required conditional use approval for drinking establishments (previously permitted)
- Added design review consideration: buildings should be oriented towards the street with entryways facing and connecting directly to the sidewalk
- Required parking may be reduced by 1/3 for all commercial uses (currently applies only to commercial uses within a multi-story mixed use building)
- Permitted multi-unit residential as stand-alone use (previously required commercial on the ground floor)

Part C: Development Standards

General Development Standards

Parking (7.12)

- Replaced requirements that were based on hard to measure metrics (e.g. number of chairs)
- Increased parking requirements for high school and warehouses
- Allowed electric vehicle charging stations to be counted as parking spaces, that a maximum of two stations per lot can be counted towards parking requirements.
- Required all multi-family buildings, including those that can be subdivided to be hard surfaced

#### Setback Standards (7.18)

- Introduced the option for the Designated Officer to require an arborist's assessment to determine the potential impact of construction to give credit for the preservation of existing trees (7.5.5)
- Added clarification that no accessory buildings or their projections can be closer than 2 feet from any property line (7.13.2)
- Permitted projections (Table 7-7) added that window wells are permitted into side yard setback up to 2 feet and introduced a maximum length of 8 feet for cantilevers to a maximum of 16 square feet

#### Use Specific Development Standards (Table 10-1)

- Addition of new classifications:
  - o Data processing centre (bitcoin mining) -Conditional Use in M1, M2, M-MX
  - o Industrial multiplex-Conditional Use in M1, M2, M-MX
  - Solar energy generating systems-Permitted Use in all zones attached to principal building
  - o Detached secondary suites-Conditional Use in DR1, DR2, RR-S, RR
  - Emergency residential shelter-Conditional Use in R-MX, C1, C2, C3, C4, C-MX, EI

#### Dimensional Standards (Table 10-2)

- Changed side yard setback for a corner lot in the 'RSU' Residential Single Use Zone to 8 feet
- Added note requiring two-unit dwellings on corner lots to have a minimum site width of 70 feet

#### Dimensional Standards for Accessory Buildings (Table 10-3)

 Amended Maximum Floor Area in the DR1 and DR 2 zone to a maximum square footage of 1000 square feet

#### Part D: Zoning Maps

Made the following map changes:

- Steinbach Arts Council from 'O' Open Space to 'E/I' Educational/Institutional
- Event Centre from Transitional POD to CBD POD and from C1 to C2
- K.R. Barkman Park: removed from CBD POD
- Cleaned up existing lots that are split zoned
- Ensure that all mapping changes reflect all re-zoning applications
- Reduced the CBD and Transitional POD on the east and south side of Main Street

#### Part E: Definitions

- Removed definitions for terms that are not used
- Eliminated contradictory definitions
- Combined uses to eliminate overlap including the following:
  - o Park and dog park
  - o Auto repair, services, sales and rental & auto parts and supplies, sales
  - Greenhouse, plant or tree nursery=landscape/garden contractor & landscape or garden supplies
  - Recreation service, indoor & Recreation service, outdoor=Community/recreation centre, sports or entertainment arena/stadium, outdoor; Amusement enterprise, outdoor; and Amusement enterprise, indoor
  - Revise definition of social services facility and add new definition of emergency residential shelter and supervised consumption site

#### **Summary**

#### <u>Purpose</u>

The purpose of subdivision 4451-2024-9020 is to conduct a boundary realignment between 111 PTH 12 North and 115 PTH 12 North.

#### Recommendation

Recommendation is for council to approve subdivision 4451-2024-9020 subject to a development agreement.

#### **Reports**

#### City Manager Report

The application for subdivision under file 4451-2024-9020 seeks Council approval for a boundary realignment involving an existing developed parcel of land (111 PTH 12N) and a generally vacant parcel of land (115 PTH 12N). Both properties are under common ownership by Clearview Consumers Coop Ltd.

The vacant parcel of land is currently accessed from PTH 12N at a signalized intersection via a shared approach at the joint property line. The proposed subdivision would relocate the shared property line further to the north and this would affect the direct access the the vacant parcel. This could be addressed through either a shared access arrangement or the development of a direct access to PTH 12N at the time of future development. This and other matters would be identified through a development agreement.

Administration recommends Council approval of subdivision 4451-2024-9020 subject to the execution of a development agreement.

#### City Planner Report

Subdivision 4451-2024-9020

#### Location:

111 PTH 12 North & 115 PTH 12 North

#### Current Designation & Zoning:

The properties are currently designated 'C' Commercial Policy Area in the Official Community Plan. The present zoning is 'C3' Commercial Corridor in the City of Steinbach Zoning By-Law 2100.

#### Current Zoning Requirements

'C3' Commercial Corridor

The Commercial Corridor district is intended primarily for uses that provide commercial goods and services to residents of the broad community and beyond; in areas that are dependent on automobile access and exposed to heavy automobile traffic, but not including regional shopping malls or regional shopping areas. These commercial uses are subject to frequent view by the public and visitors to Steinbach, and should provide an attractive appearance with landscaping, sufficient parking, and controlled traffic movement. C3 districts are generally located on arterial streets and/or at arterial/arterial intersections.

Site area-10, 000 sq feet Site width-100 feet Front yard-25 feet Rear yard-25feet Side yard (regular)-15 feet Side yard (corner)-25 feet

#### Comments/Recommendation

The purpose of SD 4451-2024-9020 is to realign the property boundaries between the two properties, 111 and 115 PTH 12 North. The owner is the same for both properties, and the intent of the application is to take approximately 11, 760 square feet from 115 PTH 12 North to increase the size of 111 PTH 12 North. As 115 PTH 12 North is approximately 1.86 acres in size, the reduction will have little to no impact on the property or for future development potential. Both properties currently share an access onto PTH 12 North, this boundary realignment will have no impact on that access.

#### **Property Access**

The boundary realignment would change the access serving these two properties so that it would only front 111 PTH 12N. A cross access agreement may be required since the Province likely would not approve a new access to the highway for 115 PTH 12N, but this could be addressed when the site is developed.

Water Servicing

111 PTH 12N is currently serviced with a 100mm PVC water service. 115 PTH 12N is not currently serviced. The Developer would be responsible for all costs associated with any alterations to existing or new water services.

Sewer Servicing

111 PTH 12N is currently serviced with a 150mm PVC sewer service. 115 PTH 12N is not currently serviced. The Developer(s) would be responsible for all costs associated with any alterations to existing or new sewer services.

Land Drainage

111 PTH 12N has an existing lot grading plan. 115 PTH 12N does not have a lot grading plan. The boundary realignment will not affect any drainage features shown on the 111 PTH 12N lot grading plan. The Developer(s) would be responsible to ensure that drainage, in the immediate area of these lots, functions properly.

Garbage Pickup

111 PTH 12N would receive regular commercial garbage collection.

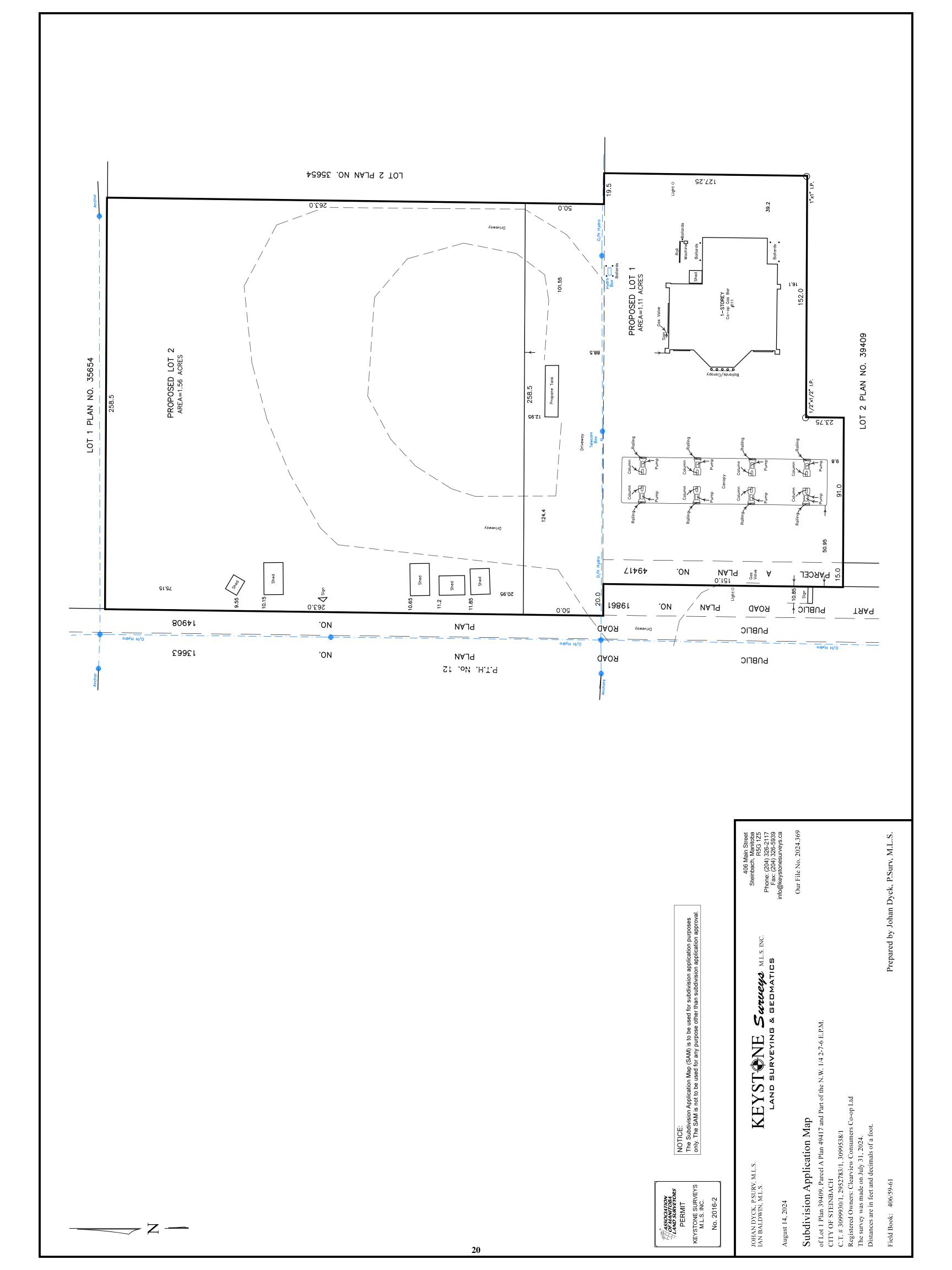

In accordance with section 2.2 of the OCP, the gas bar is appropriately located along a major street at the outer edge of the developed area. The intent of the subdivision is to put the petroleum storage on the same site as the gas bar & convenience store. Access to both proposed lots will be via existing shared driveway (located on lot 1) onto PTH 12. No concerns were raised by MTI Highways Planning and Design during circulation. Provided a declaration of right of way is obtained for use of the shared access on proposed lot 1, Community Planning has no concerns with the subdivision as proposed.

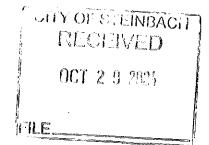

### Summary

Subject: Animal Control By-Law 2258

Purpose:

The purpose of this by-law update is to:

- Improve ability of Animal Control Officers to enforce the by-law with new provisions that allow them to seize animals when they are repeatedly found to be in contravention of by-law provisions.
- Simplify the City by-law structure by combining the pit bull by-law with the animal control by-law.
- Clarify that removal of wildlife from private property is the sole responsibility of the property owner.
- Improve administration of fees for dog license and impound by moving them from the by-law to the City fee schedule. Also recommending that dog license fees be increased.
- reduce nuisance issues that arise from unattended dogs that are left outdoors.
- Improve enforcement of dog park rules by adding provisions to the by-law.
- require owners of suspected pit bulls to obtain a veterinarians opinion as to the breed rather than relying on schedules of information in the by-law.

Recommendation:

Recommendation is to approve first reading of By-Law 2258, the Steinbach Animal Control By-Law. City Manager Comments:

Animal Control by-law 1892 was passed in 2010 and the pit bull by-law dates back to 1991. This update was initially spurred on by requests from the City's Animal Control service provider to improve their ability to address repeat offences by adding more options for seizure of animals. Since Administration was opening the by-law up for review, a number of other updates were added to the draft for consideration of Council. These suggested draft changes are intended to reduce ongoing repeated by-law contraventions and to generally reduce nuisance dog issues for residents going forward.

# **Background**

# **Key Issues:**

- Some pet owners repeatedly refuse to comply with provisions of the City by-law causing undue nuisance and hardship on their neighbors.
- City has created a dog park since the current by-law was created.
- Responsibility for removing wildlife from private property was unclear in the previous by-law. Desired Outcome(s):
- Fewer instances of long-term repeat offences that cause a nuisance for residents.
- Streamlined administration of fees
- Simplification of the City By-Law structure
- Improved compliance with rules posted at the dog park
- Improved administration of pit bull by-law provisions

# ANIMAL CONTROL BY-LAW NO. 2258

A by-law of the City of Steinbach to establish regulations for the control of dogs, cats and other animals.

Dec 3, 2024 – First Reading Dec ??, 2024 – Second and Third Reading WHEREAS <u>The Animal Liability Act</u>, authorizes the Council of any municipality to pass by-laws to prohibit and regulate the running at large or trespassing of animals and providing for impounding them and other regulations in respect thereof.

AND WHEREAS Section 232(1) of <u>The Municipal Act</u>, states that, "a Council may pass by-laws for municipal purposes respecting the following matters:

- (a) the safety, health, protection and well-being of people, and the safety and protection of property;
  - (b) wild and domestic animals and activities in relation to them ..."

AND WHEREAS Section 232(2) of <u>The Municipal Act</u>, states that "Without limiting the generality of subsection (1), a Council may in a by-law passed under this Division

- (e) subject to the regulations, provide for a system of licences, permits or approvals, including any or all of the following:
  - (i) establishing fees, and terms for payment of fees, for inspections, licences, permits and approvals, including fees related to recovering the costs of regulation."

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the City of Steinbach, in public meeting duly assembled, enacts as follows:

# PART 1: INTERPRETATION

#### 1. NAME OF BY-LAW

The name of this by-law, for citation, is the "Animal Control By-Law".

## 2. DEFINITIONS

In this by-law:

- **2.1.** "aggressive dog" means a dog with a demonstrated propensity, tendency, history, or disposition to attack without provocation other domestic animals or human beings, or a dog which has bitten another domestic animal or human being without provocation.
- **2.2.** "animal control officer" means the Animal Control Officer of the City or such other person appointed or hired under contract by the City to enforce and carry out its provisions, and includes any assistant to the Animal Control Officer.
- **2.3.** "cat" means an animal of the feline species regardless of age or sex.
- **2.4.** "City" means the City of Steinbach.
- **2.5.** "dog" means an animal of the canine species regardless of age or sex.
- **2.6.** "household pet" means a domesticated animal or bird normally kept in a dwelling and kept for pleasure rather than utility.
- **2.7.** "impound" means to take into custody, confine, and hold.
- **2.8.** "keep" means to own, possess, or harbour a dog, cat, or other animal.
- 2.9. "multi- unit residential structure" means a structure that contains three or more separate dwelling units as defined under the City Zoning By-Law.

- 2.10. "off leash area" means an area that has been designated by the City Manager or a City Manager Designate as an area in which dogs are not required to be restrained by leashes.
- **2.11.** "other animal" means any animal except a domestic dog or domestic cat.
- **2.12.** "owner", in respect of an animal, means a person, including a corporation that:
  - has been identified on the animal's license as the owner of the animal;
  - has legal title to the animal;
  - has possession or custody of the animal, whether temporarily or permanently; or
  - allows the animal to remain on their premises.
- **2.13.** "police officer" means a peace officer or constable employed by the City of Steinbach or an agency hired under contract by the City of Steinbach to provide law enforcement services.
- **2.14.** "pound" means any premises where dogs and cats are confined in accordance with the provisions of the Act or this By-law.
- 2.15. "run at large", with reference to a dog, cat or any other animal, means being elsewhere than on the property of the person who keeps the dog, cat or other animal, or of a person who has care, custody or control of the dog, cat or other animal, and not being under the immediate charge and control of a responsible person.
- 2.16. "wildlife" means any wild animal including rodents, rabbits, racoons, skunks, birds or squirrels and other wildlife as defined in The Wildlife Act.

# 3. Schedules

The schedules attached to this by-law form part of this by-law.

# 4. Severability

A decision by a court that any part of this by-law is illegal, void, or unenforceable severs that part from this by-law and is not to affect the balance of this By-law.

# **PART:2 GENERAL PROVISIONS**

# 5. Maximum number of household pets

Respecting the number of household pets permitted per household, a person may keep:

- **5.1.** a maximum of four household pets in a one-unit or two-unit residential structure with no more than three of those being dogs or cats.
- **5.2.** a maximum of three household pets in a multi-unit residential structure with no more than two of those being dogs or cats;
- **5.3.** the maximums prescribed in subsections (a) and (b) above do not include litters of dogs or cats under the age of six months.

# 6. Clean-up of Excrement (dogs and cats)

**6.1.** If a dog or cat defecates on any property within the City other than on property owned or occupied by the person who owns or is in possession or control of the dog, or cat, the person who owns or is in possession or control of the dog, or cat, shall remove such feces immediately and in a sanitary manner.

- **6.2.** Any person who owns or is in possession or control of a dog, or cat, and occupies property in the City shall;
  - remove all dog, or cat feces from said property on a daily basis and shall dispose of the feces in a sanitary manner;

# 7. Control of a dog, cat or other animal/ No running at large

No dog, cat or other animal is permitted to run at large in the City of Steinbach. A person who keeps a dog, cat or other animal, may not permit or allow the dog, cat or other animal to be elsewhere than on their property unless it is under the immediate charge and control of a responsible person.

#### 8. Seizing dogs, cats, or household pets under this By-law

- 8.1. The Animal Control Officer, a peace officer, or a police officer may seize and impound an animal that is or is found to be kept in a manner that contravenes the provisions contained in this by-law and:
  - where no action to remedy any contravention(s) is taken within 14 days of an owner or keeper of an animal being notified of by-law contravention(s); or,
  - where three or more penalty fines have been issued for the same contravention regarding that animal.
  - 8.1.1 Penalty fines or any other written communications issued by the City to an owner or keeper of an animal that outline a contravention of this by-law that has occurred are acceptable forms of notification of a by-law contravention.
- 8.2. Where an animal is determined by an Animal Control Officer to be an aggressive dog, a prohibited dog, or a prohibited animal that is a threat to public safety and where the animal cannot be securely confined on private property by its keeper or owner, an Animal Control Officer, a peace officer, or a police officer may immediately seize and impound the animal.
- **8.3.** Where a dog, cat or household pet is found to be running at large, an Animal Control Officer, a peace officer, or a police officer may immediately seize and impound the dog, cat or household pet.
- Removal of wildlife from private property is the sole responsibility of the property owner. The City or its agents shall not trap, seize or impound wildlife unless it is causing a nuisance on City owned property.

### 9. Impounding dogs, cats or other animals

Promptly upon receiving a dog, cat or household pet under section 8, the Animal Control Officer must impound the dog, cat or household pet at the pound, except that, if the Animal Control Officer believes the dog, cat or household pet is in need of medical care, the Animal Control Officer may take the dog, cat or household pet to, or leave the dog, cat or household pet with, a veterinarian.

- **9.1. Detaining impounded dogs, cats, or other animals:** The Animal Control Officer may detain for:
  - 72 hours, a dog, cat or other animal impounded under section 9;
     and
  - 21 days, a dog, cat or other animal that has bitten or that is alleged to have bitten a human being.
- **9.2.** Destroying impounded dogs, cats, or other animals for humane reasons: Despite section 9.1, if the Animal Control Officer believes that an impounded dog, cat or other animal is suffering from injury, disease, sickness, or other cause from which it is unlikely to survive or recover, and that destroying the dog, cat or other animal would be

- humane, the Animal Control Officer may destroy the dog, cat or other animal immediately without delay.
- **9.3.** Caring for impounded dogs, cats, or other animals: The Animal Control Officer may provide maintenance and care for impounded dogs, cats or other animals including the provision of food, water, shelter, veterinary care and medication that they consider necessary.
- **9.4.** Disposing of impounded dogs, cats, or other animals: After 72 hours of impoundment, the Animal Control Officer may rehome, sell by auction or private sale, or destroy an impounded dog, cat or other animal if no owner or keeper of the impounded animal makes a legitimate claim for the animal and that animal is not prohibited by this By-Law.
- **9.5.** Reclaiming impounded dogs, cats, or household pets: At any time before disposal of a dog, cat or household pet under section 9.4, the owner of the dog, cat or household pet may apply to the Animal Control Officer to reclaim the dog, cat or household pet, and, when applying, must:
  - give the Animal Control Officer proof of ownership by such person of the dog, cat or household pet;
  - pay all outstanding charges and fees under this By-law that apply to such dog, cat or household pet; and
  - pay all outstanding fines or penalties imposed on such person for contraventions of this by-law.
- **9.6.** Fees and Charges for impoundment: A person who owns or keeps a dog, cat or other animal which the Animal Control Officer has impounded under this By-law must pay on demand and before release of the dog, cat or other animal, with respect to that dog, cat or other animal:
  - the impound fee set out in the City Fee Schedule posted on the City Website;
  - the daily charge for maintaining the dog, cat or other animal set out in the City Fee Schedule posted on the City Website; and
  - the costs for veterinary care and medication that may have been incurred by the Animal Control Officer.
- **9.7. No removing impounded animals:** A person must not remove, or attempt to remove, from the pound an impounded dog, cat or other animal except as allowed under this By-law.

#### 10. Giving basic care to animals

A person who keeps or owns a dog, cat or household pet, must provide the animal with food, water, shelter, exercise and an environment that sufficiently maintains the animal in good health.

# **PART 3: DOGS**

# 11. Dog Licenses

A person may not keep a dog within the City that is older than six months unless such person has acquired a license for the dog from the City.

**11.1.** Paying for license: A person who applies for a license to keep a dog must, when applying, pay the City the fee specified in the City fee schedule which is posted on the City website. If paying the reduced fee for an altered dog, a person must produce a certificate from a veterinarian to verify such alteration.

- **11.2. Waiving license fee:** If the Animal Control Officer is satisfied that a dog has been specially trained to guide or assist a person who is disabled, and if such a person applies for a license to keep the dog, no dog license fee is payable.
- **11.3. Wearing dog tag:** A person who keeps a dog must ensure that the dog wears a collar to which is attached a tag furnished by the City when the dog is not on the owner's property.
- **11.4. No removing of dog tag:** Except with the authority of the person who keeps the dog, a person must not remove the tag required by section 11.3 from a dog's collar or from elsewhere on the dog's body.

# 12. Leashing dogs, Keeping dogs outdoors

- **12.1.** A person who keeps a dog must not permit or allow the dog to be on a street or other public place unless the dog is under the immediate charge and control of a responsible person by means of a leash that is not more than 2.5 m long or within a fenced area designated as an off leash area by the City.
- **12.2.** A person who keeps a dog must not permit or allow a dog to be leashed or tethered in such a manner that the dog can be within 3 meters (10 feet) of a sidewalk or street.
- **12.3.** A person who keeps a dog must not permit or allow a dog to be leashed or tethered in the front yard of any residential property.
- **12.4.** A person who keeps a dog must ensure that it is being actively supervised at all times by a responsible person who is capable of controlling the dog when it is outdoors on the owner's property or on the property of another person who has consented to the presence of the dog.

# 13. Aggressive dogs

- **13.1.** The City Manager, a City Manager Designate or an Animal Control Officer may designate a dog as an Aggressive Dog at their discretion.
- **13.2. Muzzling aggressive dogs:** In addition to complying with section 12, a person who keeps an aggressive dog must not permit or allow the dog to be on a street or other public place or on any other property that such person does not own or control unless such person has muzzled the dog to prevent it from biting another animal or a person, except when the dog is participating in an event sanctioned by the Canadian Kennel Club.
- 13.3. Securing aggressive dogs on private property: A person who keeps an aggressive dog must, at all times while the dog is on property owned or controlled by such person, securely confine the dog, either indoors or in an enclosed pen or other structure capable of preventing the entry of young children and adequately constructed to prevent the dog from escaping or from biting another animal or human being.

# 14. Confining dogs in heat

A person who keeps a female dog must confine and house the dog during the period it is in heat.

# 15. Confining dogs with communicable diseases

A person who keeps a dog, and who knows or suspects that the dog has a communicable disease, must:

- **15.1.** isolate the dog, during the period such person knows or suspects that the dog has a communicable disease, in a manner that will prevent further spread of the disease and in a manner prescribed at law;
- 15.2. seek the assistance of a veterinarian; and
- **15.3.** follow the orders of such veterinarian, the Animal Control Officer, and any government officials who have authority to issue such orders.

# 16. Barking or howling

A person who owns or occupies premises must not permit or allow the sound of a barking or howling dog that a person, not on the same premises, can easily hear and that disturbs or tends to disturb unreasonably the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment, comfort or convenience of such person.

# 17. Damage caused by dog(s)

- **17.1.** A person who keeps a dog, or a person who has care, custody or control of a dog, may not permit or allow the dog to upset or break into a refuse container on a street or other public place.
- **17.2.** A person who keeps a dog must ensure that the dog does not damage public or private property belonging to someone other than the owner.

# 18. Dog parks designated as off-leash areas

When a dog is in an off-leash area, the owner of a dog must:

- a) be present and have the dog within view at all times;
- b) ensure that the dog is not in heat and that it does not act in a dangerous or aggressive manner towards humans or other dogs;
- c) ensure that the dog has current rabies vaccinations prior to entry of the park;
- d) remove the dog from the off-leash area immediately if the dog is in heat or acts in a dangerous or aggressive manner towards humans or other dogs;
- e) ensure that the dog comes when called;
- f) have a leash available to restrain the dog if needed;
- g) remedy any harm caused by the dog, including filling in holes dug by the dog; and
- h) immediately remove and properly dispose of any excrement left by the dog.

# 19. Prohibited dog breeds

- 19.1. Subject to this section, no person may bring into the City of Steinbach or being its owner, allow to be in the City of Steinbach, a dog which has the appearance and physical characteristics predominantly conforming to the standards of the Canadian Kennel Club or the United Kennel Club for any of the following breeds:
  - Pit Bull Terrier;
  - American Pit Bull Terrier;
  - Staffordshire Bull Terrier;
  - American Staffordshire Terrier.
- 19.2. The owner of a dog is entitled to obtain a written opinion from an approved veterinarian actively practicing at a clinic located within the City of Steinbach as to whether a dog meets the criteria established in section 19.1. Veterinarians engaged for the purpose of determining breeds must be approved by an Animal Control Officer appointed by the City of Steinbach, the City Manager, or a City Manager Designate. Where the veterinarian concludes that a dog does not meet the criteria established under section 19.1, such a statement is conclusive proof that the dog is not prohibited under section 19.1 and no prosecution or enforcement action under section 19.1 may be undertaken with respect to the dog.

19.3. Notwithstanding section 19.1, the City Manager or City Manager Designate is authorized to issue a special permit authorizing a dog prohibited by that subsection to be in the City of Steinbach for a temporary period of time and may impose any conditions on the permit he or she considers sufficient to protect individuals and animals from any harm caused by the dog.

# **PART 4: CATS**

# 20. Spay or Neuter of a Cat

The owner or keeper of a cat over six months of age, shall ensure that such cat has been spayed or neutered, as applicable.

#### 21. Cat Identification

The owner of a cat must ensure that any cat(s) that they keep bear sufficient identification to enable any person finding the cat to contact the owner.

# PART 5: REGULATION OF OTHER ANIMALS

# 22. Prohibition against keeping certain animals

- **22.1. Prohibited Domestic Animals**: A person must not keep in the City, temporarily or permanently, any horses, donkeys, cattle, swine, sheep, goats, ducks, geese, turkeys, chickens, roosters, pheasants, quail, or other fowl except as permitted by the City Zoning By-Law on lands where Agricultural Uses are permitted.
- **22.2. Prohibited exotic or wild animals:** A person may not keep in the City, temporarily or permanently, any animal listed in Schedule B to this By-law.
- **22.3.** Exceptions to prohibitions: The prohibitions set out in sections 22.1 and 22.2 do not apply to:
  - a veterinary hospital under the control of a veterinarian registered as a member of the Manitoba Veterinary Medical Association;
  - premises operated by an institution of education for research, study, or teaching purposes;
  - premises operated by the RCMP; and
  - the pound.

# PART 6: DISPOSITION SERVICES

#### Removing carcasses

If the Animal Control Officer learns that the carcass of an animal is lying on a street or other public place, the Animal Control Officer may remove the carcass.

# PART 7: PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT

#### 23. No interfering with Animal Control Officer

A person must not interfere with, resist, withhold information regarding animals that are or have been in contravention of the by-law or otherwise obstruct the Animal Control Officer, or other person authorized under this By-law, in the performance of his or her duties.

### 24. Penalties

**24.1.** Subject to the Administrative Penalty By-Law, or a by-law implemented under the authority of the Provincial Offences Act, any person who contravenes or disobeys, or refuses or neglects to obey any provision(s) of this by-law is guilty of an offence and is liable to the fines listed in Schedule "A".

- **24.2.** Where a corporation commits an offense against this by-law, each person who is authorized, or consented to, connived at, or knowingly permitted or acquiesced in, the doing of the act that constitutes offence, is likewise guilty of the offense and liable to the penalty for which provision is made in section 24.1.
- **24.3.** Where the contravention, refusal, neglect, omission, or failure, continues for more than one day, the guilty person is liable to a separate offense for each day it continues.
- **24.4.** The costs (including legal fees related to the enforcement) of an action or measure taken by the City under this by-law are an amount owing to the City by the person who contravened the by-law, The Municipal Act, The Planning Act, or any other Act the City is authorized to enforce.
- 24.5. In addition to all other rights of collection which the City may have at law, such amounts may be collected by the City in the same manner as a tax may be collected or enforced under The Municipal Act.

# 25. Inspection

- **25.1.** An Animal Control Officer or City Manager Designate may enter land/property, buildings or structures at any reasonable time to carry out an inspection, enforcement or action, or request that anything be produced to assist in the inspection, remedy, enforcement or action taken.
- **25.2.** An Animal Control Officer or City Manager Designate must display or produce upon request identification showing that they are authorized to make the entry.
- **25.3.** An Animal Control Officer or City Manager Designate may take written notes of any violations that may exist, and may take photographic evidence, which will be kept on file.
- 25.4. An Animal Control Officer or City Manager Designate may conduct any further inspections necessary to determine whether the actions or measures set out in a Notice of Contravention or an Order to Remedy a Contravention have been taken to remedy the contravention or situation, or to prevent a reoccurrence of the contravention.
- **25.5.** It shall be an Animal Control Officer or City Manager Designates opinion and discretion whether a Notice of Contravention or Order to Remedy a Contravention have been complied with.

# PART 8: REPEAL AND ENACTMENT

The following by-laws are hereby repealed:

- Animal Control By-Law No. 1892 (2010)
- Pit Bull regulation By-Law No. 1307 (1991)

#### **SCHEDULE "B" PROHIBITED ANIMALS:**

- All dogs, other than domesticated dogs (Canis Familiaris), including, but not limited to, wolf, fox, coyote, hyaena, dingo, jackal, raccoon dog, bush dog, and any hybrid offspring of a wild dog and domesticated dog.
- All cats other than domesticated cats (Felus catus), including, but not limited to, lion, tiger, leopard, ocelot, jaguar, puma, panther, mountain lion, cheetah, wild cat, cougar, bobcat, lynx, serval, and any hybrid offspring of a wild cat and domesticated cat.
- 3. All bears, including polar, grizzly, brown and black bear.
- 4. Crocodilians including alligators and crocodiles
- 5. Reptiles and snakes classified as venomous, whether or not they have venom glands.
- 6. All snakes of the families Pythonidae and Boidae.
- 7. Green anaconda (Eunectes murinus), yellow anaconda (Eunectes notaeus), reticulated python (python reticulates), African rock python (python sebae), Burmese python (python molurus bivittatus), Indian python (python molurus molurus), or amethyst python (morelia amethystina)
- 8. Any snake or species or subspecies of a snake that can reach an adult length greater than three meters, whether the particular snake exceeds that length or not.
- 9. Any lizard of a species or subspecies of a lizard that can reach an adult length greater than two meters, whether the particular lizard exceeds that length or not.
- 10. All venomous or poisonous animals.
- 11. Any animal defined as wildlife in The Wildlife Act

# CITY OF STEINBACH By-Law No. 1892

BEING A BY-LAW of the City of Steinbach, for establishing regulations for the Control of Dogs, Cats and other Animals.

WHEREAS <u>The Animal Liability Act</u>, authorizes the Council of any municipality to pass by-laws to prohibit and regulate the running at large or trespassing of animals and providing for impounding them and other regulations in respect thereof.

AND WHEREAS Section 232(1) of <u>The Municipal Act</u>, states that, "a Council may pass by-laws for municipal purposes respecting the following matters:

- (a) the safety, health, protection and well-being of people, and the safety and protection of property;
  - (b) wild and domestic animals and activities in relation to them ..."

AND WHEREAS Section 233(2) of <u>The Municipal</u> Act, states that "Without limiting the generality of subsection (1), a Council may in a by-law passed under this Division

- (e) subject to the regulations, provide for a system of licences, permits or approvals, including any or all of the following:
  - (i) establishing fees, and terms for payment of fees, for inspections, licences, permits and approvals, including fees related to recovering the costs of regulation."

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the City of Steinbach, in public meeting duly assembled, enacts as follows:

# SECTION 1 INTERPRETATION

# Name of By-law

1.1 The name of this by-law, for citation, is the "Animal Control By-Law".

#### **Definitions**

- 1.2 In this by-law:
  - (a) "aggressive dog" means a dog with a known propensity, tendency, or disposition to attack without provocation other domestic animals or human beings, or a dog which has bitten another domestic animal or human being without provocation;
  - (b) "animal control officer" means the Animal Control Officer for the City or such other person appointed or hired by contract by the City to enforce and carry out its provisions, and includes any assistant to the Animal Control Officer;
  - (c) "cat" means an animal of the feline species regardless of age or sex;
  - (d) "city" means the City of Steinbach;
  - (e) "dog" means an animal of the canine species regardless of age or sex;
  - (f) "domestic cat" means an animal of the feline species regardless of age or sex that resides in residence for humans without a cage;
  - (g) "euthanasia" means the methods described in American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) Guidelines on Euthanasia 2007 or an updated version;
  - (h) "household pet" means a domesticated animal or bird normally kept in a dwelling and kept for pleasure rather than utility;
  - (i) "impound" means to take into custody, confine, and hold;
  - (j) "keep" means to own, possess, or harbour a dog, cat, or other animal;
  - (x) "kitten" means a member of the feline species which is less than six months old;
  - (1) "other animal" means any animal except a dog or domestic cat;
  - (m) "puppy" means a member of the canine species which is less than six months old;

- (n) "police officer" means a peace officer or constable employed by the City of Steinbach or by contract with the RCMP;
- (o) "pound" means the location where the Animal Control Officer takes into custody, confines and holds animals;
- (p) "run at large", with reference to a dog, cat or any other animal, means being elsewhere than on the property of the person who keeps the dog, cat or other animal, or of a person who has care, custody or control of the dog, cat or other animal, and not being under the immediate charge and control of a responsible person.

#### Schedules

1.3 The schedules attached to this by-law form part of this by-law.

#### Severability

1.4 A decision by a court that any part of this by-law is illegal, void, or unenforceable severs that part from this By-law, and is not to affect the balance of this By-law.

#### **SECTION 2**

# **GENERAL - HOUSEHOLD PETS**

#### Maximum number of household pets

- 2.1 Subject to the maximums per species outlined in this by-law, respecting the number of animals permitted per household, a person may keep:
- (a) a maximum of four household pets in a one-family or two-family dwelling.
  - (b) a maximum of three household pets in a multi-family dwelling.
- (c) the maximums prescribed in subsections (a) and (b) above do not include litters of puppies or kittens.

# SECTION 3 DOG LICENSES

# No keeping of dog without license

3.1 A person must not keep a dog within the City that is older than three months unless such person has acquired a license for the dog from the City.

# **Applying for license**

3.2 A person who keeps a dog must apply to the City for a license when the person acquires the dog.

#### Paving for license

3.3 A person who applies for a license to keep a dog must, when applying, pay the City the fee specified in Schedule "A" to this By-law and if paying the reduced fee for an altered dog, produce a certificate from a veterinarian to verify such alteration.

# Waiving license fee

3.4 If the Animal Control Officer is satisfied that a dog has been specially trained to guide or assist a person who is disabled, and if such a person applies for a license to keep the dog, no fee is payable under section 3.3.

### Wearing dog tag

3.5 A person who keeps a dog must ensure that the dog at all times wears a collar to which is attached a tag furnished by the City.

# No removing of dog tag

3.6 Except with the authority of the person who keeps the dog, a person must not remove the tag required by section 3.5 from a dog's collar or from elsewhere on the dog's body.

# SECTION 4 CONTROL OF DOGS

### Controlling a dog / No running at large

4.1 A person who keeps a dog, or a person who has care, custody or control of a dog, must not permit or allow the dog to be elsewhere than on his or her property unless it is under the immediate charge and control of a responsible person. A person who keeps a dog must not permit or allow the dog to run at large.

# Leashing dogs

4.2 A person who keeps a dog must not permit or allow the dog to be on a street or other public place unless the dog is under the immediate charge and control of a responsible person by means of a leash that is not more than 2.5 m long or another City by-law allows the dog to be off-leash under certain circumstances.

# Muzzling aggressive dogs

4.3 In addition to complying with section 4.2, a person who keeps an aggressive dog must not permit or allow the dog to be on a street or other public place or on any other property that such person does not own or control unless such person has muzzled the dog to prevent it from biting another animal or a person, except when the dog is participating in an event sanctioned by the Canadian Kennel Club.

# Securing aggressive dogs on private property

4.4 A person who keeps an aggressive dog must, at all times while the dog is on property owned or controlled by such person, securely confine the dog, either indoors or in an enclosed pen or other structure capable of preventing the entry of young children and adequately constructed to prevent the dog from escaping or from biting another animal or human being.

# **Limiting number of dogs**

4.5 Except for a person licensed under the City's License By-law as a kennel keeper, any person in a one-family or two-family dwelling, must not keep more than three dogs at any time, and any person in a multiple-family dwelling must not keep more than two dogs at any time.

# **Confining dogs in heat**

4.6 A person who keeps a female dog must confine and house the dog during the period it is in heat.

# Confining dogs with communicable diseases

- 4.7 A person who keeps a dog, and who knows or suspects that the dog has a communicable disease, must:
  - 1. isolate the dog, during the period such person knows or suspects that the dog has a communicable disease, in a manner that will prevent further spread of the disease and in a manner prescribed at law;
  - 2. seek the assistance of a veterinarian; and
  - 3. follow the orders of such veterinarian, the Animal Control Officer, and any government officials who have authority to issue such orders.

#### **Clean-up of Excrement**

- 4.8 (a) If a dog defecates on any property within the City other than the property of the person who owns or is in possession or control of the dog, the person who owns or is in possession or control of the dog, shall remove such feces immediately and in a sanitary manner.
- (b) Any person who owns or is in possession or control of a dog, and occupies property in the City, shall remove any and all dog feces from the said property on a daily basis and shall dispose of the feces in a sanitary manner.

# **Securing dogs in vehicles**

4.9 A person who keeps a dog, or a person who has care, custody or control of a dog, must not keep the dog in a vehicle unless such person secures the dog in a manner that prevents the dog from falling or being thrown out of the vehicle.

# **Barking or howling**

4.10 A person who owns or occupies premises must not permit or allow the sound of a barking or howling dog that a person, not on the same premises, can easily hear and that disturbs or tends to disturb unreasonably the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment, comfort or convenience of such person.

# Upsetting or breaking into refuse container

4.11 A person who keeps a dog, or a person who has care, custody or control of a dog, must not permit or allow the dog to upset or break into a refuse container on a street or other public place.

# SECTION 5 KEEPING OF DOGS

# Giving basic care to dogs

5.1 A person who keeps a dog, or a person who has care, custody or control of a dog, must give the dog food, water, shelter, and exercise sufficient to maintain the dog in good health.

#### **Tethering dogs**

A person who keeps a dog, or a person who has care, custody or control of a dog, must not tie or fasten a dog to a fixed object by using a choke collar or choke chain or by tying a rope, chain, or cord directly around the dog's neck. Any chain, leash, or similar device for animal constraint shall be designed to prevent choking or injury to the dog, and the tethering device shall be at least 4 meters in length and placed on a swivel or chain run. The tether mentioned in this section shall not permit the dog to be within 3 meters of a sidewalk or street, and shall not be allowed in any front yard.

#### **Enclosing dogs**

5.3 A person who keeps a dog, or a person who has care, custody or control of a dog, must not confine the dog in an enclosure unless the air ventilation, temperature, and size of the enclosure are sufficient to maintain the dog in good health.

# SECTION 6 IMPOUNDMENT OF DOGS

# Seizing dogs under this By-law

- 6.1 The Animal Control Officer or a police officer may seize a dog:
  - (a) in respect of whom the person who keeps a dog does not have a license;
  - (b) in respect of whom payment of the license fee referred to in section 3.3 is in arrears;
  - (c) who is not wearing the dog tag referred to in section 3.5;
  - (d) who is on a street or other public place unlawfully including running at large; or
  - (e) who has bitten or who is alleged to have bitten a human being.

# **Delivering dogs without tags**

- 6.2 If
  - (a) the Animal Control Officer believes that a dog is not wearing the collar and tag required under section 3.5;
  - (b) the Animal Control Officer requests the person who keeps the dog, the person who has care, custody and control of the dog, or a person who occupies the property where the dog is situate to produce evidence satisfactory to the Animal Control Officer that the dog has a license; and
  - (c) the person referred to in clause (b) fails to produce such evidence; the Animal Control Officer may request delivery of the dog to the Animal Control Officer or to the pound, and, immediately upon receipt of that request, the person referred to in clause (b) must deliver the dog to the Animal Control Officer or the pound.

# **Impounding dogs**

6.3 Promptly upon receiving a dog under section 6.1 or 6.2, the Animal Control Officer must impound the dog at the pound, except that, if the Animal Control Officer believes the dog is in need of medical care, the Animal Control Officer may take the dog to, or leave the dog with, a veterinarian.

# **Detaining impounded dogs**

- 6.4 The Animal Control Officer may detain for:
  - (a) 72 hours, a dog impounded under section 6.3; and
  - (b) 21 days, a dog who has bitten or who is alleged to have bitten a human being; after the date and time of impoundment.

#### **Destroying dogs for humane reasons**

6.5 Despite section 6.4, if the Animal Control Officer believes that an impounded dog is suffering from injury, disease, sickness, or other cause which it is unlikely to survive or from which it is unlikely to recover, and that destroying the dog would be humane, the Animal Control Officer may destroy the dog immediately.

# Caring for dogs

6.6 The Animal Control Officer, as he or she considers necessary and humane, may maintain and care for impounded dogs including the provision of food, water, and shelter, and may arrange for veterinary care and medication.

# **Disposing of dogs**

6.7 After expiry of the 72 hours referred to in section 6.4, the Animal Control Officer may destroy, or sell by auction or private sale, an impounded dog.

# Reclaiming dogs

- 6.8 At any time before destruction or sale of a dog under section 6.7, the person who keeps the dog may apply to the Animal Control Officer to reclaim the dog, and, when applying, must:
  - (a) give the Animal Control Officer proof of ownership by such person of the dog;
  - (b) pay all outstanding charges and fees under this By-law that apply to such dog; and
  - (c) pay all outstanding fines or penalties imposed on such person for breach of this by-law.

# SECTION 7 <u>KEEPING OF CATS</u>

#### Giving basic care to cats

7.1 A person who keeps a cat, or a person who has care, custody or control of a cat, must give the cat food, water, shelter, and an environment sufficient to maintain the cat in good health.

#### **Enclosing cats**

7.2 A person who keeps a cat, or a person who has care, custody or control of a cat, must not confine the cat in an enclosure unless the air ventilation, temperature, and size of the enclosure are sufficient to maintain the cat in good health.

## **Cat Identification**

7.3 A person must ensure that a cat bear sufficient identification to enable any person finding the cat to contact the owner.

# **Clean-up of Excrement**

7.4 (a) If a cat defecates on any property within the City other than the property of the person who owns or is in possession or control of the cat, the person who owns or is in possession or control of the cat, shall remove such feces immediately and in a sanitary manner.

(b) Any person who owns or is in possession or control of a cat, and occupies property in the City, shall remove any and all cat feces from the said property on a daily basis and shall dispose of the feces in a sanitary manner.

# Spay or Neuter of a Cat

7.5 Any person who owns a cat over six months of age, shall ensure that such cat has been spayed or neutered, as applicable.

# Controlling a cat / No running at large

7.6 A person who keeps a cat, or a person who has care, custody or control of a cat, must not permit or allow the cat to be elsewhere than on his or her property unless it is under the immediate charge and control of a responsible person. Any cat is not permitted to run at large.

#### Limiting number of cats

7.7 Except for a person licensed under the City's License By-law as a kennel keeper, any person in a one-family or two-family dwelling, must not keep more than three cats at any time, and any person in a multiple-family dwelling must not keep more than two cats at any time.

#### **SECTION 8**

# **REGULATION OF OTHER ANIMALS**

# **Controlling other animals**

8.1 A person who keeps an other animal, or a person who has care, custody or control of an other animal, must not permit or allow the other animal to be elsewhere than on his or her property unless it is under the immediate charge and control of a responsible person.

# Prohibition against keeping certain domestic animals

8.2 A person must not keep in the City, temporarily or permanently, any horses, donkeys, cattle, swine, sheep, goats, ducks, geese, turkeys, roosters, pheasants, quail, or other fowl, except that this prohibition does not apply to areas of the City in which the City's Zoning By-law allows the keeping of such animals, to licensed pet shops or pet care facilities or kennels, and except as permitted by section 8.4.

# Prohibition against keeping certain exotic or wild animals

8.3 A person must not keep in the City, temporarily or permanently, any animal listed in Schedule B to this By-law, except as permitted by section 8.4.

# **Exceptions to prohibitions**

- 8.4 The prohibitions set out in sections 8.2 and 8.3 do not apply to:
  - (a) the Steinbach Humane Society
  - (b) a veterinary hospital under the control of a veterinarian registered as a member of the Manitoba Veterinary Medical Association;
  - (c) premises operated by an institution of education for research, study, or teaching purposes;
  - (d) premises operated by the RCMP; and
  - (e) the pound.

# Prohibition against keeping excessive numbers of certain animals

- 8.5 A person must not keep in any area, temporarily or permanently, at any one time, more than:
  - (a) four, in aggregate, hamsters, guinea pigs, tame mice, chinchillas, rabbits, and other small animals and reptiles including snakes, not referred to in Schedule B; or
  - (b) eight, in aggregate, registered homing pigeons, canaries, budgerigars, parrots, parakeets, and exotic birds of all species, except that a person who has successfully obtained a Conditional Use from the City to keep an aviary in Agricultural Zoning may have a greater number of such birds in or about the premises designated in the Conditional Use.

# **Housing for animals**

8.6 In addition to the other requirements of this By-law, the owner of any animal, bird, or reptile must provide for its housing in a suitable manner, and must maintain such housing in a clean and wholesome state appropriate for the particular animal, bird, or reptile.

# Seizing other animals under this By-law

8.7 The Animal Control Officer or a police officer may seize an other animal that is elsewhere than on property referred to in section 8.1, and that is not under the immediate charge and control of a responsible person or where an other animal is being kept by a person in contravention of this by-law.

#### Impounding other animals

8.8 Promptly upon receiving an other animal under section 8.7 or 8.8, the Animal Control Officer may impound the other animal at the pound.

# **Detaining impounded other animals**

8.9 The Animal Control Officer may detain an other animal impounded under section 8.8 for 48 hours.

#### Caring for other animals

8.10 The Animal Control Officer, as he or she considers necessary and humane, may maintain and care for impounded other animals including the provision of food, water, and shelter, and may arrange for veterinary care and medication.

# Destroying other animals for humane reasons

8.11 Despite section 6.11, if the Animal Control Officer believes that an impounded other animal is suffering from injury, disease, sickness, or other cause which it is unlikely to survive or from which it is unlikely to recover, and that destroying the other animal would be humane, the Animal Control Officer may destroy the other animal immediately.

#### Disposing of other animals

8.12 After expiry of the 48 hour period referred to in section 8.9, the Animal Control Officer may destroy, or sell by auction or private sale, an impounded other animal.

# Reclaiming other animals

- 8.13 At any time before destruction or sale of an other animal under section 8.12, the person who keeps the other animal may apply to the Animal Control Officer to reclaim the other animal and, when applying, must:
  - (a) give the Animal Control Officer proof of ownership by such person of the other animal;
  - (b) pay all outstanding charges and fees under this By-law that apply to such other animal; and
  - (c) pay all outstanding fines or penalties imposed on such person for breach of this by-law.

# SECTION 9 DISPOSITION SERVICES

# **Removing carcasses**

9.1 If the Animal Control Officer learns that the carcass of an animal is lying on a street or other public place, the Animal Control Officer may remove the carcass.

# SECTION 10 EUTHANASIA

# Destroying of an animal

10.1 Any reference to the destroying of an animal will follow the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) Guidelines on Euthanasia. The principle for a humane

method of killing an animal is a rapid unconsciousness and death, with the least possible pain and distress accompanying the procedure. The most appropriate method of euthanasia may vary depending on the circumstances and the animal species. Euthanasia is not desirable as a sole means of population control, but is a necessary requirement for unwanted companion animals. Optimal methods of euthanasia will be used. Shooting an animal is considered a humane way to destroy an animal as it produces immediate unconsciousness prior to death. Shooting may be the most practical and logical method of euthanasia of wild or free ranging animals. Gunshot will not be used for routine euthanasia of animals in animal control situations.

# SECTION 11 CHARGES AND FEES

#### **Charging for impoundment**

- 11.1 A person who keeps a dog or other animal which the Animal Control Officer has impounded under this By-law must pay to the City on demand and before release of the dog or other animal, with respect to that dog or other animal:
  - (a) the impound fee set out in Schedule A;
  - (b) the daily charge for maintaining the dog or other animal set out in Schedule A; and
  - (c) the costs for veterinary care and medication that may have been incurred by the Animal Control Officer.

#### **SECTION 12**

# OFFENCES AND PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT

# No removing impounded animals

12.1 A person must not remove, or attempt to remove, from the pound an impounded dog or other animal except as allowed under this By-law.

#### No interfering with Animal Control Officer

12.2 A person must not interfere with, resist, or otherwise obstruct the Animal Control Officer, or other person authorized under this By-law, in the performance of his or her duties.

# Offences under By-law

- 12.3 A person who:
  - (a) violates any provision of this By-law, or does any act or thing which violates any provision of this By-law, or allows any other person to do any act or thing which violates any provision of this By-law;
  - (b) neglects to do or refrains from doing anything required to be done by any provision of this By-law; or
  - (c) allows any other person to fail to comply with an order, direction, or notice given under any provision of this By-law;
  - is guilty of an offence against this By-law, and liable to the penalties imposed under this Section.

#### Fine for offence

12.4 Every person who commits an offence against this By-law is punishable on conviction by a fine of not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$2,000.00 for each offence.

# Fine for continuing offence

12.5 Every person who commits an offence of a continuing nature against this By-law is liable to a fine not exceeding \$50.00 for each day such offence continues.

# SECTION 13 REPEAL AND ENACTMENT

# Repeal

13.1 This by-law repeals By-Law No. 1213.

# Force and effect

13.2 This by-law is to come into force and take effect on the date of its enactment.

# **SCHEDULE "B" TO BY-LAW 1892**

# PROHIBITED ANIMALS

- 1. Canids including coyotes, foxes, jackals, and wolves but excluding domestic dogs
- 2. Hyenas
- 3. Crocodilians including alligators and crocodiles
- 4. Ursids including bears
- 5. Felids including lions and tigers but excluding domestic cats
- 6. Reptiles and snakes classified as venomous, whether or not they have venom glands.
  - All snakes of the faiies Pythonidae and Boidae.
- 7. Green anaconda (Eunectes murinus), yellow anaconda (Eunectes notaeus), reticulated python (python reticulates), African rock python (python sebae), Burmese python (python molurus bivittatus), Indian python (python molurus molurus), or amethyst python (morelia amethystina)

# 2024 Animal Control By-Law Update: Summary & Rationale for Draft Changes

All draft changes to Animal Control By-Law 1892 are highlighted yellow in the attached draft. A summary of changes including rationale is provided here below:

# 1. General cleanup of language and formatting

The old by-law included several similar provisions for dogs, cats and other animals separately. Where possible these have been combined into the General Provisions section to be more concise. Overall, even though a number of provisions have been added, the new by-law draft is slightly shorter than the current by-law.

# 2. Updates to Provisions regarding Seizing dogs, cats or household pets.

#### - Section 8.1, 8.2:

The current by-law allows seizure under the following circumstances:

- No dog license
- Dog license is expired or dog is not wearing City dog tags
- Dog has bitten or is alleged to have bitten a human being
- Dog or Cat is running at large

The draft by-law adds provisions to allow Animal Control officers to seize animals:

- For any by-law contravention that isn't remedied within 14 days of giving notice
- For situations where 3 or more tickets have been issued for the same offence
- That are a threat to public safety (eg. pit bulls, prohibited animals or aggressive dogs that are not properly confined)

# 3. Added clarification regarding wildlife:

- Section 2.20 & 8.4: Define what is meant by wildlife and clarifies that removal of wildlife is the responsibility of each individual property owner.

# 4. Fees moved to the City Fee Schedule

#### - Section 9.6 & 11.1

Dog license and impound fees are currently listed in the existing Animal Control by-law. The draft by-law removes the fees from the by-law and refers to the City Fee Schedule that Council reviews annually instead. This allows Council and Administration to update fees easier and more regularly as needed.

#### Dog License Fee Comparisson:

Steinbach:	lifetime license	\$25 unaltered	\$10 altered

Brandon:	Annual license	\$57.50 unaltered	\$21 altered

Selkirk: Annual license Free Free

Dog license fees do not cover the cost of providing animal control services although most animal control costs are associated with the stray cat population. Administration recommends that the license fees remain on a lifetime basis and that rates be increased to \$60 for an unaltered dog and \$25 for an altered dog to help offset some Animal Control costs associated with dog owners.

# 5. Maximum age of Dog before license requirement

#### - Section 11.1

The current by-law requires Dogs older than 3 months to have a dog license. Upon review of other municipalities in MB, Winnipeg, Brandon and PLP all have this set at 6 months and Winkler and Selkirk have it set at 4 months. Recommending that this be changed to 6 months for Steinbach.

# 6. New provisions regarding keeping dogs outdoors

#### -Section 12.4

The intent is to reduce issues that arise from residents leaving dogs out in the yard during the day while they are away. The new by-law draft requires dog owners to have a responsible person who is capable of controlling the dog present on their property when their dog is outdoors.

#### -Section 17.2

This addition requires that whoever is looking after a dog must not allow the dog to damage public or private property belonging to someone other than the owner.

# 7. New provisions for rules in dog parks

- Section 2.13: Definition for an "off leash area" added to the draft by-law to reflect the existing dog park in LA Barkman park and any others that may be created in the future.
- <u>Section 18:</u> Added rules that are posted on signage at the dog park to the by-law to improve enforceability and clarity regarding what is expected.

# 8. Provisions for identification of a pit bull

Pet owners who are asked to remove their dog from the City because it appears to be a pit bull will often argue that their dog is not a pit bull. Pit bull by-law # 1307 currently relies on information in the schedules to determine whether a dog is a pit bull or not. The draft by-law requires the pet owner to obtain a veterinarian's opinion as to the breed of the dog instead. This improves objectivity and reduces liability for the City and Animal Control Officers.

# 9. Removal of Euthanasia and animal welfare provisions

#### -BL 1892 Section 1.2(g), 10.1

The current by-law includes information regarding euthanasia. While these provisions are informative, they are so specific that they can become outdated. The City does follow humane practices in it's Animal Control activities as required by the Manitoba Animal Care Act.

#### -BL 1892 Section 4.9, 5.2, 5.3

These sections of the current by-law deal with securing dogs in vehicles, tethering dogs (specific info about types of leashes) and enclosing dogs. The provisions contained in these sections are addressed by the Manitoba Animal Care Act and enforced by provincial Animal Control Officers.

Section 10 of the draft by-law addresses general humane care of Animals that is expected of pet owners in Steinbach and it reasonably addresses the intent of the sections that have been removed.

# 10. Increase to penalty fines

Fines for contraventions that have a higher risk to public safety or that are associated with higher animal control costs have been increased in this draft.

Fines for the following contraventions are increased from \$50 if paid in 7 days and \$100 thereafter to be \$100 if paid in 7 days and \$200 thereafter:

s. 7	Fail to prevent animal from running at large	<mark>200</mark>	<mark>100</mark>
s.18	Fail to comply with off-leash area provisions	<mark>200</mark>	<mark>100</mark>
s. 20	Fail to spay or neuter a cat	200	100

The fine for failure to ensure a dangerous or aggressive dog remains contained on private property or muzzled when off private property is increased from \$100 if paid in 7 days and \$200 thereafter to \$200 if paid in 7 days and \$400 thereafter.

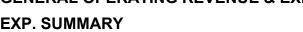
