Property Tax Statements

Property tax statements for Steinbach have been mailed and are due **September 27, 2024**. Tax statements are mailed to the current owners at time of printing. It is the property owners' responsibility to obtain a copy should they have recently purchased a property and not received a tax statement. If you are expecting a tax statement and have not yet received a copy or if your mailing address has changed recently, please contact City Hall at 204-326-9877 or e-mail taxes@steinbach.ca.

How to Pay Taxes

Recommended: TIPP Program

The Tax Installment Payment Plan allows taxpayers to have payments automatically withdrawn on the first business day of each month, or to pre-authorize a single annual payment, equal to the balance due on your property tax statement, on tax due date in September.



Online banking. The City of Steinbach is registered to accept online bank payments. Please be aware of your financial institution's processing time to ensure your online payment is received by the due date.

By mail. Along with the bottom portion of the tax bill, cheques can be made payable to the City of Steinbach and mailed to the address above. Please ensure payments are received at City Hall on or before the due date.



In person. Bring your tax bill and payment to City Hall (see address above) between 8am and 4pm, Monday to Friday. Credit cards are not accepted. If paying by debit, please ensure you have set up the necessary limit with your bank.



24 Hour Drop Off. Along with the bottom portion of the tax bill, payment can be submitted via the drop box located at the Administration entrance of City Hall, facing Reimer Avenue. It is not advised to put cash in the drop box.

Notes from the Mayor's Office



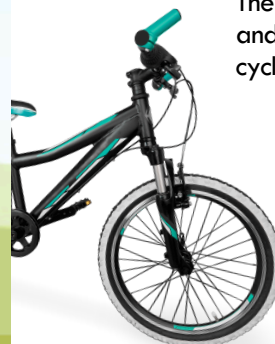
Share your thoughts with the Mayor!

Residential Fence Construction

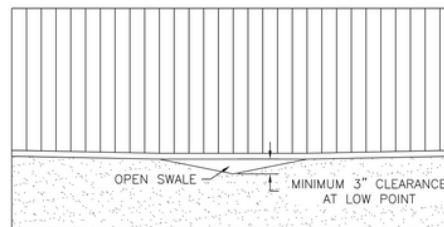
Planning on constructing a fence this summer? Please consider the following reminders before starting your project.

- A building permit is not required, however, there are some rules and guidelines to follow. Contact the City's Building Inspection department or visit www.steinbach.ca to be informed of general rules and guidelines regarding fence installation.
- Confirm your property line location to ensure your fence is on your property; if property pins are not present or appear to have been disturbed, contact a legal surveyor to have them reinstated.
- Visit ClickBeforeYouDigMB.com and submit a request to get the locations of underground utility lines marked out prior to placing posts.

Does your property have rear yard swales?

Please note that:

- Rear yard swales are critical to local drainage and must remain free of obstruction.
- The bottom of fences crossing swales should have a straight bottom and not follow the contour of the swales (see illustration below or by scanning the QR code).
- Once the fence is installed, monitor the swale, and remove any obstructions (sticks, bags, leaves/grass clippings) that may get caught by the fence and restrict the flow of water.
